For us data Geeks, it's about how good of a job we did to identify, rationalize, and enable our corporate Data Assets and realize the effect of those assets on driving Business success. It seems to me that to answer those questions correctly (i.e., Yes, Yes, No), there has to exist a 'good' understanding of the business requirements and there has to exist a robust Information Governance framework. Without these items effectively in place, that fancy 'data lake' (or any data store) we just stood up will turn into more of a data swamp...and will do so fairly quickly.

So the lesson for us Data Provocateurs is to help our Business and IT partners to not solely focus on the technology aspect of Big Data (i.e., the supporting "mark-itecture" provided by the vendors) but to have a better understanding of the business requirements, or more so the business outcomes, and to follow a robust Information Governance framework. The promises of Big Data (or any data-centric effort for that matter) can be achieved by following these concepts and help assure we properly address those three questions from above.

Regarding the concept of Information Governance, I have been vacillating on this for some time now and will look to expand on the concept in a future newsletter. In the meantime, here's wishing all your Data aspirations for the next year come true....!!!
