From the President's Pen...

Hello Folks,

Welcome to the Fall season, or is that Autumn...guess either term will work if they mean the same, right? Which gets me to the topic of this article: the meaning and importance of a data dictionary and a business glossary. Are these the same thing or are they two different things? Let's look at each of these items. A business glossary is a collection of business terms and definitions that describe aspects of an organization's business structure, products, and operations. The main driver is a consistent view and understanding of data assets. A data dictionary is a collection of information that denotes aspects of an application, dataset, or data model. The main driver is a distinct view and purpose for data assets being used.

I've been at organizations that treated them the same, but in reality they are different. Generally, a Data Governance (DG) group would oversee the Business Glossary, either at a corporate level or a business unit level. The business terms would be vetted and approved via an intake process and then reviewed periodically to adjust for organizational or operational changes. The DG group would work with data stewards and business area SME's in collaboration to update and maintain the business glossary. A data dictionary captures metadata associated with an application component or data subject area used within an organization. This data dictionary would be built and maintained by business analysts, software analysts, and data analysts. Data architects would generally use a data dictionary to help describe their data models.

This topic is front and center for the assignment I'm currently working on for an insurance client. We are standing up a brand new data warehouse for the Claims business area and have to engage the DG folks to understand what is in the current business glossary. We also have to put together data dictionaries for the data models and denote linkages to the business glossary. This, along with data lineage from source applications, are primary artifacts that solidify the data models. With this information available from the business glossary and data dictionary, we can generate source-to-target mapping (STM) documents directly from the data models, which is a nice productivity enhancer. I'm currently following this approach with ER/Studio, and I am assuming it would work for Erwin as well...

In the end, a business glossary is indeed different from a data dictionary. A good way to keep them straight is to view a business glossary as a "business compilation of data items" and a data dictionary as an "IT framework for data items." You can refer to publications like TDAN to get more information on these concepts. Also, a number of vendors have put together some good documentation on this topic, albeit to the benefit of whatever tool they are trying to get you to use... \bigcirc

We could spend hours on this topic—and maybe you already have at your organization!

I hope everyone has an enjoyable and fruitful Autumn (or Fall) and look forward to folks attending our upcoming chapter meeting!
