For DAMA Indiana, 2012 was another great year of learning more about our profession and building relationships with other members.

Below are a few highlights of chapter activities in 2012:

January:

This time we had clear skies - not a snowflake in sight to disrupt our plans (A welcome change from the blustery weather in 2011!).

Robby Slaughter, founder of Slaughter Development, discussed insights from his new book "Failure: The Secret to Success."

Antonio Amorin, founder of Data Innovations, Inc., discussed data standards (a topic near and dear to our hearts).

Tony Shaw and Peter Aiken gave us a preview of the 2012 Enterprise Data World Conference. Big Data was expected to be a "hot topic" for the conference.

Donna Burbank, from Computer Associates, talked about different data modeling techniques and the concept of data vault.

We covered three of the hot topics from the survey: Master Data, Meta-data, and Data Warehousing.

We also had our first set of lunch-time table discussions (hopefully the first of many!) and Steve Hoberman gave us a preview of the inaugural Data Modeling Zone conference.


Join us on Thursday, January 17th for an informative day you won't want to miss!

Please note: We are at the Eli Lilly Corporate Center, in the same room as the October 2012 meeting.




Spotlight: Member Evaluations
